



School Sports Premium Report

Purpose of Funding –Rationale

Vision: All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport

The Government has provided funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/2016 in the form of a 'Sport Premium'. This funding, only to be spent on PE and sport, is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will go directly to schools who will decide what is best for their children's needs with the aim of improving the quality of provision in every state primary school in England.

For 2015 - 2016 Inkpen received a total of £8,316 in sports funding

How Funding Is Being Used & Who Is Benefitting.

1. Affiliation with West Berks School Sports + Newbury & District Football Association

- The affiliation with Park House School Sports enables us to enter a range of tournaments and competitions within the area, giving the children a taste of competitive sport, which is not easily done in a small school
- For the last year, we have also joined Newbury and District Schools Football Association so that our football club is able to enter competitions on a more regular basis
- The affiliation also offers CPD training for all staff in a range of sporting activities The Sports funding helps to pay for the supply cover for teachers to attend these courses
- A selection of specialist coaches is also made available through affiliation. At Inkpen, we have chosen to use this extra coaching to provide specialist gym teaching across the school this year

What impact did this have?

- Children were able to take part in competitions with children from other schools Our football team even came 2nd and 3rd in a couple of tournaments – an excellent result considering the size of the school. The sporting timetable has been set up to take into account tournaments we know we enter and train for them. The aim is to gradually build up the variety of tournaments the school enters over time

- Funding for the coaches to take children to some of these tournaments has also been covered by the funding – without this, the costings would not be viable and parent transport is not always available
- Sporting visitors helped to inspire the children in all areas of the curriculum, not just sport

2. Hiring Qualified Sports Coaches To Work Alongside Teachers

- Having a specialist PE coach in school helped to increase subject knowledge for teachers via observation of the coach.
- In the longer term, teachers are then able to teach good or better P.E. lessons independently.
- Pupils receive high quality P.E. lessons from a qualified coach for one lesson each week, developing the skills necessary to partake in a range of sports
From September, the sports coach has been delivering lessons twice weekly to the junior children as he has been so successful over the last year.
Staff continue to work alongside the coach for CPD purposes
- Engagement and enthusiasm in PE has increased greatly, with children responding positively to a “proper” coach
In a school with an all-female staff, having a male coach has been really good for all children
- There is the opportunity created for an extra-curricular after-school club run by our qualified sports coach – PPG children are offered this club as a priority
The take-up of this club has been very positive, with lots of feedback from parents about how every child looks forward to multi-skills club all week
- Other coaches have also been bought in for “1 off” sessions when appropriate
This year we have had Bollywood dancing in school as part of a X-Curricular Diwali week
- Year 3-5 go swimming every spring term – This funding has helped the school to subsidise this cost to parents.
This will not be done again as recent guidance says that the money should not be used for statutory requirements such as swimming
During this swimming time, Y1&2 participate in PE lessons with our coach.
- We have also been able to organise a short 6-week canoeing course for our Y6 pupils which will be offered to them after SATs in the summer term.

How Is Impact Being Measured?

- Children will make accelerated progress in developing skills through a range of, games, evident through assessment procedures in the subject
- Direct feedback will be given by teachers on the quality of support offered by the specialist
- Improvement in children’s interest in sports clubs in and outside of school – achievements outside school are celebrated in regular HT newsletters
- When entering tournaments, the children are beginning to perform better as they become more confident with the routines of such things

What Impact Did This Have?

- Children have been introduced to new skills in activities they had previously had little knowledge or interest in, both during PE lessons and after school, such as climbing, dance and canoeing
- Children made good progress in developing specific skills as identified in year group schemes of work
- Teachers gained valuable ideas for future planning, including ideas for warm ups and cool downs
- One-off enrichment sports days allowed children access to activities that fall outside “normal” School sports – these included Bollywood dancing and the climbing wall

Purchasing Sports Equipment

When purchasing new sports equipment for the school, we need to think about:

- Improved quality as well as the quantity of equipment
- Increasing the quantity of equipment to allow more children to be actively involved during lessons
- To improve the provision of extra-curricular activities

This year we have bought Athletics equipment. This is a set of activities for the children to use in small groups, which can be used outside as well as in the hall. This athletics training links directly to a tournament in the autumn term, which Y5/6 attend.

The school has now funded a new PE shed.

When this has been put up, an audit will be carried out on all our equipment, with a view to using the money that has been carried over from previous years to replace old equipment.

What impact would this have?

Children would gain access to improved quality of equipment during PE lessons as well as extra-curricular activities.

Children would have the opportunity to use new, up-to-date equipment in all PE lessons – improving engagement.

How would this Impact be measured?

- There would be an improvement in children’s ability to talk about the skills they develop during lessons using apparatus and equipment
- There would be an improvement of children’s use of equipment and apparatus, showing development of skills
- Children will perform better at tournaments we enter – this is already starting to be the case.

How will this be sustained?

- The Sports Funding grant has now been guaranteed until 2020 and so we will continue to employ a specialist sports coach for the school. Our coach will continue to work alongside members of staff, who will then also be able to deliver high quality PE lessons to the children. When the funding finishes, all avenues will be explored to continue to employ our coach as he is a valued member of staff and really appreciated by pupils and parents alike.
- New equipment bought with the funding has already increased the range of sports that can be accessed at Inkpen and will continue to do so as the range is extended further.
